Elder Services

We take pride in providing a range of essential elder services to support and enrich the lives of our elders. Our dedicated team ensures that every elder in our community receives the care and assistance they need.

Our services include:

- Transportation Assistance: We offer reliable transportation to dental and medical appointments, elder shopping trips, wellness/cultural events, and more. Please note that a 2-3 day notice is required for all transportation requests to ensure we can accommodate everyone's needs. Failing to do so, or asking the day of, may result in unavailable transportation due to other scheduled transports.
- Covid Boxes: In these challenging times, we are committed to providing Covid boxes to our elders, ensuring they have access to essential supplies and support.
- Member Services: As part of our comprehensive care, we offer various member services, such as bus passes, emergency food cards, and assistance with resource applications and loan requests.
- Sherwood Valley Food Distribution (comads): Through this program, we ensure that nutritious food reaches those in need, promoting health and well-being within our community.
- Prescription Pick Up & Delivery: Our team is here to help with the smooth and convenient retrieval of prescriptions, ensuring that elders have access to their medications without any hassle.

OVC (Office for Victims of Crime) and OVW (Office on Violence Against Women) victim services play a vital role in providing essential support and resources to victims of crime and violence. These agencies are dedicated to ensuring that victims receive compassionate care, guidance, and access to justice throughout their recovery journey. Our Victim Advocates offer a wide range of support, including crisis intervention, court accompaniment, supportive letters, talking circles and referrals to community resources.

EPA

Our dedicated team is actively engaged in various crucial initiatives. One of our top priorities is the Save the Hitch campaign, which aims to protect the endangered fish that has been an integral part of our Tribal heritage for generations. While facing challenges, we are heartened by the successful fish rescues in the drying tributaries, and we continue to represent the tribe's interests on this matter.

Another concern revolves around Cyanobacteria in Clear Lake, rendering it unsafe for fish consumption and traditional gathering of plants relied upon by our Tribal communities. As representatives on the Blue-Ribbon Committee, we are committed to addressing this significant issue.

Collaborating with the Tribal Eco Restoration Alliance and Lake Water Resources Department, we are actively engaged in the Cal EPA Highland Springs Project, documenting native plant species and providing essential public education to both tribal and non-tribal community members.

Additionally, our partnership with Cal Fire, Robison, and Tribal Eco Restoration Alliance enables us to enhance fire safety in Scotts Valley through signage and the creation of a fire break at the Red Hills property.

Thanks to our Listos California grant funding, we have emergency preparedness kits and information available to you. Community Emergency Response Team Training is occurring August 10-11th at our 2150 Main Street office location in Lakeport. You must complete 12 hours of online training before attending. There will be another one in the fall so be on the lookout for that notice



Partnership with OVC and TANF are ongoing in our efforts to ensure the culture of the tribe is revived and maintained.
